First and foremost I'd like to thank you for buying my guide, this truly is the easiest ways to make a LOT of money using Fiverr in only a short period of time, so let's begin!

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I am not responsible for anything you do with this guide.

1 – Making yourself look legit

It's common sense that <u>No one</u> will buy a gig from someone who joined Fiverr 20 minutes ago, you must look "real" before someone will buy your gig.

The best way to start up is to write an about me, put some bullshit like "I've worked in the advertising industry for 15 years, I know the in's and out's and the tricks and tweaks" for your avatar put something, put ANYTHING as your avatar. For my account it was a monkey with a gun and I got \$50 within a Few Days on Fiverr. The best thing to do though is to get a GFX artist to make an avatar that says something that matches the types of gigs you usually created i.e Advertising. Now idle on Fiverr for about 2 days until you start anything, just look around on the site and maybe even buy someone else's gig, It'll make you look more legit. I actually did leave my whole profile blank for the first 2 weeks I was at Fiverr and I got a LOT less sales than my 2nd month. So you must make sure the community won't see you as a complete scam as soon as you start, better be safe than sorry.

2 – Choosing a gig

Now you want to choose the general area you like to do. Make sure you pick something extremely easy, the kind of work you will be doing is quite blackhat.

The area I initially chose was Advertising -> Flyers & Handouts, the people in this section are usually people who are looking for a quick gig that will promote their business big time, now keep in mind about half of these people are probably people just like you maybe even coming from the same forum as you so always keep in mind that you are not invincible.


Your gig must look a bit like this, you may copy what I wrote here because as of writing this I have not published this gig nor do I plan to do so so you may use what I wrote but remember that after this Ebook goes for sale, a lot of people will be using my template.

Anyways the key features that <u>MUST</u> make your gig stand out if the delivery time and how many flyers you pass out. Most people on Fiverr charge \$5 for 50 black and white handouts so saying 150 flyers is just around the target area, but don't go over 200 because once you do it starts smelling fishy. Make your delivery time 2-3 days because most people going on Fiverr really want their business to blow up <u>NOW</u> so putting a short delivery time is golden and never put any longer than 3 days.

Ok I got it, but how am I going to make any money? I don't want to do any work! Well I'm a lazy fuck just like you so this is exactly what I did, you're not

even going to <u>put the flyers up</u> so you do this, after a day or two mark your gig as delivered, of course since you didn't do it you will have no proof to attach so do what I did here:



This was like my first time ever doing this, so I was naïve and didn't think someone would let me basically scam them. As I started realizing I could I made my response say "I did the job and if you really want proof I can do it

but it'd be a huge burden for me to go find the proofs since I did it a while ago" and 9 times out of 10 people will not ask for proof. If you get the occasional guy asking for proof then actually get off your ass and give him proof, it actually helps to put a few proofs up on your gig every now and then.

3 – Promoting your gig

To maximize your sales, promote your gig everywhere, both online and offline. Have someone make a flyer that says "Get hundreds of new customers easily, find out how at http://bit.ly/urlink" never direct link Fiverr in your flyer

Nobody can see you putting up the flyers since your service is basically a scam so it is best to do it in neighborhoods that are not your own and do it at night so people won't be on your ass. If you know there's going to be i.e an election party with a lot of people you don't know, go to the party and OFFER YOUR SERVICES TO THE PARTY GUESTS during a time of an election, advertising the candidate is prime and it a very big focus of their campaign. So they could possibly have you in the next town over "Handing out flyers daily" and paying you for it, now just how awesome and simple is that, and best of all since you met these people in real life they WILL NOT ask for proof, and that's just one example of offline marketing. Online marketing is a bit less successful since so many people do it but you can still talk on forums with inactive staff etc. etc.

Enhancing your gig

Gig extras are absolutely AMAZING. Once you reach level 2 they're enabled. With them you can charge someone say an extra \$10 to hand out 300 more color flyers or deliver the order in just one day or really just anything you can think of. And as always, make sure you never touch on the topic of proof and if they do swerve away from it because the gig extras will make you a shit load of extra money for doing absolutely nothing more. And of course as you reach level two, you also gain trust so you have a much better chance of not being

reported to Fiverr and get more sales. If you get a negative review talk with the user about why you got it and if they say like "Well my site got no clicks so I'm pretty disappointed" say something like "I totally get that but a negative review really hurts my gig and after all on Fiverr you're paying for what the seller provides not what you receive." I actually don't think this is even an official Fiverr rule, but it sure sound like one. :D
